- 5. To understand the relationship of building materials, technology, structural systems & building services with architecture

# Preamble

Today, in Mumbai, women play integral roles in the economic and social sectors. However, many face challenges by societal dynamics and economic disparities. The need to uplift and empower women in Mumbai is crucial for fostering a more inclusive and equitable society. Recognizing these challenges, there is a need to enhance women's skills and provide opportunities that can strengthen their socio-economic standing.

# **Programme Brief**

The Women's Skill Development Centre in Mumbai is a collaborative effort between the government and nongovernmental organizations, envisioning a transformative impact on the lives of women in the city. This joint initiative is driven by the shared goal of empowering women through skill development, thereby enhancing their socio-economic standing. The project encompasses a comprehensive approach to bridge existing gaps, providing not only skills training but also creating an environment conducive to entrepreneurship and sustainable livelihoods. The architectural design aims to reflect this vision, fostering an inclusive and empowering space that aligns with the unique socio-economic fabric of Mumbai.

The Women's Skill Development Centre in Mumbai, a collaborative venture by the government and NGOs, is dedicated to empowering women through comprehensive skill development. At the core of this initiative is a tailored training program designed to bridge gaps, promote entrepreneurship, and create an inclusive space that aligns with Mumbai's unique socio-economic fabric. In addition to this, the centre will include spaces such as hostels, a creche, a canteen, and an exhibition cum sale area. These facilities are integral to providing a holistic learning and living environment, enhancing the impact of the program, and supporting women in their journey towards a brighter future.

# **Proposed Site**

The proposed Women's Skill Development Centre is strategically located in the heart of Mumbai, amidst a vibrant urban landscape. With Chunabhatti railway station on the west, the proposed center benefits from convenient access to public transportation, facilitating ease of commute for users. Surrounded by informal settlements and residential areas, the proposed site offers a diverse community backdrop. Adjacent to the site dies Someye ground

to the east, to the south, a non-vehicular area below the flyover enhances pedestrian connectivity, with the presence of a nearby police station ensuring safety.


With its central positioning amidst bustling urban life, the proposed centre serves as a vital hub for empowering women and addressing socio-economic disparities. Its accessibility to public transportation and proximity to residential neighborhoods underscore its significance in skill development and community empowerment efforts. The site's surroundings offer opportunities for meaningful engagement and collaboration, making it an ideal location for fostering positive change in the heart of Mumbai.

# Methodology

# Week 1 and 2: Project Inception and Background research

Students will be working in groups to study the NGOs to understand the efforts taken for women's betterment in Mumbai on all fronts, the current situation of the socio-economic structure, and their needs.

Students will study and analyze the stipulated area through various parameters and conduct detailed background research on various NGOs in Mumbai and study them in detail. This would lead to the finalization of architectural intervention as an AD studio project.

Identification of the site and user needs through surveys and consultations. Establish design goals and principles.



Once the above base is ready, students will receive an outlined design program which will then be detailed by each student, individually.

# Weeks 3-4: Conceptualization and Ideation

Brainstorm design concepts considering site and user analysis.

Develop initial sketches and diagrams to illustrate key design ideas considering factors like sustainability, and flexibility.

# Weeks 5-6: Preliminary Design Development

Refine selected concepts into more detailed schematic designs.

Consider spatial arrangements, circulation, and aesthetic elements.

Weeks 7-8: Design Refinement

Design esquisse aligning with the project. Develop 3D visualization, integrate feedback from critique sessions, and ensure the designs are culturally sensitive and inclusive.

Weeks 9-10: Design Finalization

Finalize architectural drawings, and define material specifications, construction systems, work on details, etc

# Weeks 11-12: Pre-final review and portfolio preparation

A compilation and presentation of the design for critical review and preparation of the final portfolio incorporating feedback.

# Weeks 13-14: Final Presentation and Documentation

Prepare a comprehensive portfolio showcasing design evolution, ensuring that the final design responds to the needs of skill enhancement of the primary users.

# Integration of Design

Students will get a dedicated week for Architectural Design studio to work on their design and prepare the drawings to be translated into the final portfolio. This week will focus on integration with all other technical subjects like building services, building construction, etc. by having the involvement of other faculty members to resolve the technical issues with students' designs. Students are expected to incorporate the topics learned in these subjects into their designs..






This involves considering working moms' needs into account while designing flexible office layouts, accessible restrooms, and nursing places. Such layouts can encourage female leadership and engagement in the workforce.
- Howing and Accessibility: A key component of women's empowerment is having access to affordable housing. In order to meet the requirements of women, including single mothers, elderly women, and women with disabilities.
- Community Conters: Community centers with distinctive architectural features can operate as foci for initiatives promoting women's

- empowerment. These facilities includes hosting training sessions, support groups, and workshops, giving women a tangible location to access resources and form networks.
- Educational Facilities: Schools and other educational institutions are crucial to the empowerment of women. In order to close the gender gap in education, architectural design may make sure that these places are secure, hospitable, and favorable to learning.
- Healthcare Facilities: It is crucial to design healthcare facilities with women's unique requirements in mind.
- Community Gordens: By giving people the chance to grow their own food, connect with environment, and forge a feeling of community, community gardens and green spaces can be created to empower women.
- 'Co-Living and Co-Working Spaces: In order to empower women professionals and entrepreneurs, co-living and co-working spaces' can encourage networking and collaboration between them.

#### 1.2. AIM

To design a sustainable and inclusive urban environment that not only empowers women by providing safe spaces but also promotes gender equality and social equity, addressing the unique needs and challenges faced by women in our society.

#### 1.4. NEED FOR THE PROJECT

India has struggled for a long time with severe gender gaps. In the areas of politics, healthcare, work, and education, women frequently experience discrimination. In order to close these inequalities and provide equal opportunities for women, for which empowerment initiatives are essential.

- Educational Inequality: Girls still have limited access to high-quality education in many areas of India. Women's capacity to make wise decisions about their lives is hampered by this lack of education, which reinforces gender-based disparities.
- Economic Independence: In India, where women's labor force participation rates are still comparatively low, economic empowerment of women is essential.
- Political Underregressentation: At both the national and city levels, women are significantly underrepresented in political roles. Better policies addressing the interests and concerns of women can result from political empowerment.

- solfhcare Access: Reproductive rights and women's health are frequently overlooked. Access to high-quality medical services is a requirement for empowerment.
- Preperty and Inheritance Bights: Women have limited access to property and inheritance rights in several areas of India. To solve these concerns, empowerment includes legislation reforms and awareness efforts.
- Reval Empowerment Women frequently encounters particular difficulties in rural locations, such as limited access to resources and job opportunities. For overall development, empowerment initiatives for rural women can have a big impact.
- Entropressential and leadership: For the nation to grow fully, women must be encouraged to take up leadership positions in business and government.

# Engendering Cities - driving gender inclusion for better cities workshop

## Introduction:

With growing urbanisation, cities create a dichotomous and complex condition for its citizens. On one hand, it offers employment opportunities for all including women and on the other hand there are infrastructure provision deficits and challenges, especially in transportation, housing and amenities. Where does gender, women, and women's rights factor into this complex process? Among all attempts towards city planning, the aspirations of the women in a city are yet to be realised as they have largely been excluded from the project of city making. There are challenges but also great opportunities for urban transformation, inclusion and change. How will the "inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable cities and settlements" expressed in Sustainable Development Goal 11, be fully integrated with the vision of gender equality articulated in Sustainable Development Goal 5? The workshop is an attempt to engage students to address some of the questions with the design and planning tools.

# Aim & Objective:

The workshop aims to sensitise the students about the need for gender inclusive planning by using tools at the city/ regional, urban design and architectural building scale. It will concentrate on the Urban Design scale and take a sectoral approach in assessment of transport, social, governance and design of a brownfield area and to ensure safety and inclusivity in a Greenfield area. It will enable the students to know and use the tools for preparing a gender



inclusive plan through a hands-on exercise.

## Methodology & process:

- The process to be followed in the workshop included: Knowledge sharing: Experience sharing about the urgent need for gender inclusion through various research, surveys and projects carried out by Akshara Centre with a focus on the development plan process for gender amenity inclusion.
- Through design and planning: Imparting of Gender planning methods at various levels by recognising, advocating, planning, policy making, surveys, designing, retrofitting, etc.
- Using audit and analysis tools: Sharing of audit surveys devised by Akshara through case studies and applying in the local street.


# Academic and professional development & expected learnings through the Workshop:



PiCA celebrated Women Equality Day on August 29, 2023, with esteemed guests Major Priyanka Gupta and Mrs. Priya Tetgure, in the presence of students and members from the Women's Development Cells (WDC) of PIMSR, PCE, and PCACS departments at the Pillai Institute. The Women Development Cell at PiCA initiated this event to commemorate Women Equality Day and honor women who have gone above and beyond to pursue their dreams and careers.

The event took place in the 7th-floor Auditorium, running from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm, and attracted a large audience from various departments. Ar. Sayalee Kulkarni began the event with a welcoming address, shedding light on the historical significance of the day for women worldwide. The distinguished guests were warmly received by Dr. Sudnya Mahimkar, Principal of PiCA, and Prof. Smita Dalvi, a member of Soroptimist India.

Ar. Sayalee Kulkarni introduced the guest speakers, starting with Mrs. Priya Tetgure, an assistant loco pilot who predominantly operated passenger trains, roro trains, mail express, and even goods trains, primarily on the Ratnagiri Roha Ratnagiri routes. Her responsibilities included assisting the locomotive pilot while driving the train, monitoring signal aspects, ensuring track safety, and making quick decisions when needed.

The second guest speaker was Major Priyanka Gupta, an architect by profession and Co-founder and Head of Marketing at VISOL renewable energy solutions, a solar consulting and EPC company. She also served as an ex-Army officer, commissioned into the Corp of Engineers of the Indian Army in March 2003.

Both speakers shared their enlightening journeys and the challenges they faced when choosing unconventional career paths. They discussed how they overcame gender bias and societal norms to pursue their dreams, offering guidance to the female audience on being prepared for unforeseen challenges in their career paths and staying self-safeguarded.

Major Priyanka Gupta's presentation deeply moved the audience as she recounted her journey from being an architect to serving in the Army, where she led a bridge company with approximately 200 male soldiers under her command. The session was highly inspiring, leaving attendees filled with pride for having such strong women among them.




The gathering ended with an expression of gratitude, leaving all the women in the room filled with pride, motivation, and a sense of empowerment as they departed for the day.





















Dr. Kirti Samudra personally counseled the participants, emphasizing the importance of maintaining healthy hemoglobin levels. Each participant received chickpeas and jaggery packets, known for their efficacy in boosting hemoglobin levels.

Once their hemoglobin testing was completed, participants were directed to the CPR training conducted on the ground floor by an experienced team of doctors. CPR training proved to be a valuable initiative for handling emergencies.



Among the various blood tests available for female patients, hemoglobin stands out as one of the most crucial. Beyond its ability to identify anemia, a common and potentially problematic condition for women throughout their lives, this straightforward test also aids in detecting several other health issues. According to a 2018 study in Expert Review of Hematology, an iron-deficient state can profoundly impact a woman's physical and emotional health. Despite the prevalence of anemia among women, it tends to be underdiagnosed and undertreated, leading to serious complications.

In support of the Anemia Mukt Bharat campaign by the government of India, the Women Development Cell of PiCA and Bharat Vikas Parishad collaborated to organize an exclusive hemoglobin retesting camp for anemic females at the Institute. This camp followed a previous event held on September 6th, during which all female teaching, non-teaching, and helper staff underwent hemoglobin level tests. Anemic participants received supplements to improve their hemoglobin levels and were retested for progress.

The camp was meticulously organized, ensuring all necessary medical arrangements were in place for the expert medical team from Heroglobin to conduct the tests. Female staff from all branches of the institution were invited to participate, resulting in an overwhelming response and benefiting a large number of participants. Medications prescribed for two months demonstrated positive effects on many anemic individuals, with observed increases in hemoglobin levels compared to the initial readings. Participants with persistently low hemoglobin levels were given additional medications and advised to incorporate iron-rich diets into their daily routines.


The success of the camp was attributed to excellent teamwork, with support from student volunteers, the senate council, and the Anubhuti team ensuring the smooth execution of the campaign.
